

providing specialist cancer services, training, development and research. This will also help us to improve both cancer treatments and outcomes for our patients.

We have been working closely with our contractors to develop a construction plan designed to minimise disruption to clinical services. We will ensure the site is managed in an environmentally and socially considerate manner, and will endeavour to keep disturbance, such as noise and dust, to a minimum. However, there will be some noise at times, such as when the foundations are laid. Works which are known to be very disruptive to patients, staff or visitors will be undertaken, wherever possible, at weekends.

We make sure that the nursing staff on your ward are kept up to date with any information on likely disruptions, so please speak to them.
The project will be completed in **autumn 2016**.

Developments around London Bridge



The South Bank of the Thames has always played a significant role in the rise of London as a world city – an economic, social and cultural magnet that draws people to live and work in the area.

London Bridge occupies an important area of London that has witnessed many of the major developments from The Shard, The Place and Guy's Tower, and now to the London Bridge station redevelopment and the construction of a new Cancer Centre at Guy's.

We wanted to explain more about these developments, as you may encounter some disturbance during your stay.

London Bridge station development



London Bridge station is currently being transformed to create new platforms for more trains, build a new concourse and create a bigger and better station for passengers. It is the fourth busiest station in the country, bringing around 50 million passengers into the city each year. The changes will allow the introduction of

hundreds of Thameslink trains every day – one every two to three minutes – offering better connections than ever before.

The improvements will be funded by the Thameslink programme, which is a £6bn Government investment in rail which will lead to a better rail network for London and Britain.

This work will be completed in **summer 2018**.

During your stay you may encounter some disturbance from this work. Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust are working closely with Network Rail and their contractors to ensure that any necessary noisy work is carried out at pre-arranged times. We are also liaising with nursing staff on your ward to make sure they are kept up to date with information that may cause any disruption.
